

Hang It!

How to hang your project on a wall!

Supplies & Tools:


- Creation Station 1 Yard Fabric Panel (Purchased from [JoAnn Fabrics](#))
- 6 yards double fold bias tape (2 packs) in coordinating color
- 1 yard (36"x45") medium weight fusible interfacing
- Removable marking pen

Stabilizing Your Hanging


1. Place your panel face down on a table. Place your fusible interfacing, fusible side down, onto the back of the panel. Following manufacturer's instructions, iron the interfacing to the panel. Trim edges if necessary. **The fusible side of the fabric is typically raised with small glue bumps.

Stitching Your Bias Tape Together

1. Open one end of each strip of double fold bias tape. Position the strips perpendicular to each other with right sides together and raw edges aligned. Pin.




2. Draw a diagonal line on the top bias strip from top left to bottom right and sew on that line creating a seam.



3. Trim your seam allowance to 1/4" being careful to not cut the stitching. Press the seam allowance open.



4. Fold and press your edges toward the center of the bias strip and then fold the strip in half and press again to re-create your bias tape.



Finishing Your Edges with Bias Tape

1. Open the bias tape and align the raw edge of the narrower side of the tape with the raw edge of the right side of the fabric.
2. Stitch in the fold line of the bias tape and wrap around to conceal the raw edges.
3. Top stitch the bias tape making sure to catch the back side and press down to finish.
4. With your excess bias tape cut 4 strips at 4" long. Stitch each bias tape strip shut.
5. Create loops with each piece of bias tape and attach to desired location on the top of the panel. Stitch to the wrong side of the fabric.

**We suggest placing 2 loops at each corner of the panel and then placing the other two in any desired location between.
